**(LITTLE ROCK, AR)** – The Arkansas Arts Center will present a “conversation” with Elizabeth Brim as part of the Friends of Contemporary Craft annual lecture series on Sunday, March 14, 2010, at 6 p.m. in the Arkansas Arts Center Lower Lobby.

Work by blacksmith Brim is anything but typical. Her pieces consist of tiaras, Sunday hats, and tutus. Having been raised in a female dominated household, Brim remembers the frilly dresses her mother sewed for her and her sister to play in. She describes her art as “playing dress-up,” creating works that allow her to have a good time in the process. She is currently employed at the Penland School of Crafts in North Carolina where she teaches blacksmithing and metal work.
