**(LITTLE ROCK, AR)** – The Arkansas Arts Center and University of Arkansas Clinton

School of Public Service will present a special lecture with internationally acclaimed architect James Polshek as part of the Arkansas Arts Center's Art of Architecture lecture series. The lecture will be held Tuesday, September 30, 2008, at 6 p.m. at the Clinton School of Public Service. The lecture is also presented by the University of Arkansas School of Architecture; American Institute of Architects, Central Arkansas Chapter; and Friends of Architecture.

Polshek will discuss his career and design work. Polshek's completed designs include: the William Jefferson Clinton Presidential Center, Little Rock; Carnegie Hall, New York; the Brooklyn Museum; and the Ed Sullivan Theater, New York. Polshek founded his firm, Polshek Partnership Architects, in 1963. He has served as the dean of Columbia University's Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation. He has received many awards for his work including the Gold Medal award from the New

York City chapter of the American Institute of Architects in 1986 and the Municipal Art Society's Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis Medal in 2002.
