Found in Translation: The Development of a Japanese Legacy in America

(LITTLE ROCK, AR) – *Found in Translation: The Development of a Japanese Legacy in America*, a lecture by Lee Love, will be held on Thursday, September 16, 2010 at 6 p.m. in the Arkansas Arts Center Lecture Hall.

Lee Love studied under the great American ceramist, Warren MacKenzie, as well as Japanese master, Tatsuzo Shimaoka. Love acquired a folk craft foundation during a three-year apprenticeship in traditional Japanese folk pottery with Shimaoka. He deepened his understanding of craft by setting up a wood kiln and studio amongst the orchards and rice paddies of Mashiko. In his lecture, Love will discuss how the art of Japanese ceramics influenced American art and craft.
